Boundary Working Group | Project Plan

Boundary Survey #2 provided three pieces of information: 1) Success Stories/Best Practices of WYS Associations managing boundary situations in the past, 2) A list of boundary situations that are still "open" and may be good material to support further WYS Boundaries work, and 3) a list of WYS Association members interested in becoming part of a working group to move WYS Boundaries work forward.

At the 2023 WYS AGM a goal has been set to present the following materials -

- 1) Case Study Review & Recommendation Current boundary issue diagnosis and progress to date, and
- 2) Proposal for additional follow-on WYS Boundaries work for WYS Member Association consideration.

We'd like to utilize the Boundary Working Group volunteers to guide the above action items and subsequent reporting. To do this, a three-meeting series will be set up for the Working Group to drive progress in this sequence:

Prior to Working Group Meeting #1, distribute Survey #2 Results (to come later this week) to guide initial discussion and introduce current issue / case study.

Meeting #1 (Friday, 4/21, 12-1p PT) | Review Survey #2 results for clarity, host quality discussion that organizes work on the case study and create homework assignments and deliverables for Working Group Meeting #2.

Meeting #2 (week of May 7, 2023) | Review homework results, hold further discussion to clarify & propose a path forward if possible, and identify case study open issues to clarify prior to the WYS 2023 AGM.

Annual General Meeting (May 20, 2023) | Present the Review, Recap, and Proposal described above and solicit broad membership feedback.

Meeting #3 (week of May 21, 2023) | Discuss the AGM results on the Boundaries session and reach consensus on if/how more Boundaries work should be done (e.g. continue the Working Group?, form a standing Boundaries committee?, abandon the discussion altogether?).

The structure of this project is to utilize the Working Group volunteers for a finite amount of time working on specific deliverables to grow WYS expertise in managing boundaries across the state. At the end of this short-term assignment, decisions will be made to continue or not and if continue is selected, reconstituting the Working Group to something more permanent may be wise. In other words, volunteering for the Working Group results in a temporary engagement for a couple of special topic meetings and some homework but does NOT automatically assign a person to something that could be a lot of work to make real progress across a variety of situations. Volunteering should not result in a huge task being permanently thrust on the people that raise their hands.


- 1st Experience, Train with Sporting Club Portugal (SCP) Academy.

OVERVIEW:

- Longstanding (and growing) disconnect between State Referee Association and Local Referee Associations
 - Recognized by both groups but willingness to work together to find solutions TBD
 - Misalignment of objectives entry vs exit
- Biggest impact is on Referee Training Program efficiency
 - Bottlenecks in system (800 referees waiting on training courses to be certified)

NEXT STEPS:

- Engage SRA to better understand referee training and what is causing the bottleneck Call scheduled with Leslie Poirier
- Follow up discussion with additional local referee associations Follow up needed
- Work toward shortening gap between State and Local Referee Associations Follow up needed



Chairperson | Sandy Hunt

• This position per USSF Policy 531 and SRC Bylaws (per Policy) – <u>requires the concurrence of both State Playing Associations – Adult & Youth</u> for a two-year term. The position has been open for several years now. Per Policy, if there is no Chairperson, then the State Referee Administrator (SRA) fills this roll.

State Referee Administrator | Jim Kritzberg

• This position per Policy – <u>requires the concurrence of both State Playing Associations – Adult & Youth for a two-year term.</u> I have filled this role since 2013 and wish to retire. I will agree to continue in this role for some time, not forever (at age ~73 [74 on this Saturday) until replaced. Currently there are no known candidates.

State Youth Referee Administrator | Richard Meeks

• This position per Policy – <u>requires the appointment by the Youth State Playing Associations after consultation with the Adult State Playing Association</u> for a two-year term. This position is currently filled by Richard Meeks.





GOVERNING DOCUMENTS (BYLAWS) FOR THE WASHINGTON STATE REFEREE COMMITTEE APPROVED AUGUST 12, 2015

Officers under Article IV section B shall be appointed as follows:

- a. Chairperson Appointed jointly by the Youth State Association and Adult State Association Presidents to serve a two year term. May be re-appointed at the discretion of the State Associations.
- b. SRA Appointed jointly by the Adult and Youth State Associations within the State. A mutually acceptable nominee will be selected by the US Soccer Referee Committee and the Board when the State Associations cannot agree. The SRA shall be appointed for a specified two (2) year term and may be reappointed. An interim SRA may be appointed, as provided in this section, to fill a vacancy during the specified two (2) year term.
- c. SYRA Appointed by the Youth State Association President after consultation with the SRA. The SYRA shall be appointed for a specified (2) two year term. The SYRA may be reappointed. An interim SYRA may be appointed to fill a vacancy during the specified two (2) year term.
- d. SDA and SDI, SDofA, Treasurer and Secretary Appointed by the State Referee Committee after SRA consultation with the State Association Presidents, for an initial appointment of two (2) years, with subsequent appointments at the pleasure of the State Referee Committee Board.
- e. Youth Association Representative and Adult Association Representative shall be appointed by their respective State Associations, for an initial appointment of two (2) years, with subsequent appointments at the pleasure of their respective Presidents.
